

Michelle is a former New Zealand international Hockey player.

Her international career started in 1999 with a game against England.

She played at the Olympics at Sydney in 2000, (Olympiam No 853), the Commonwealth Games at Edinburgh in 2002 and at Melbourne in 2006, four Champions Trophy tournaments (1999, 2000, 2001, 2002) and one World Cup in Australia in 2002.

She played her 100<sup>th</sup> game against England in the bronze medal decider at the Commonwealth Games in 2006, unfortunately with no medal.

She retired from Hockey, after the Commonwealth Games in 2002 & then returned in 2005 (after having her first baby, Katie).

She retired a second time, after the Commonwealth Games in 2006 to concentrate on her family and her business interests with her husband Mark.

Michelle played a total of 100 games for New Zealand.

She also represented Manawatu and Canterbury at a senior level in the NZ Hockey league, winning a total of 7 national titles, one with Manawatu and 6 with Canterbury, two as captain.
